- b. can demonstrate a specific passion for a particular industry; an industry focused around a commodity or a service to those who produce an agricultural product.

Directions:

Most all applicants have a large list of varied life experiences that make them very qualified for these awards. It is challenging for the selection committee to select and judge which experiences best qualify the applicant for these awards. Therefore, we ask that the applicants choose for themselves a short list of their experiences that best qualify themselves for these awards.

To encourage careful selection and worded responses, applicants are restricted to the space provided. The restricted space causes the applicant to carefully consider all of their background and choose those items which best makes the case that they are the applicant to be awarded.

Additional pages or words not requested will result in disqualification of the application. So it is critical to adhere to these requirements.

Careful attention to presentation of the material (spelling, grammar, wording, organization) is important to successful selection as well. Succinct, factual statements are more beneficial than verbose phrases without specific content.
