FFA teams from 10 chapters including 35 individuals participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide students an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Nursery/Landscape. The event consisted of a general knowledge exam, a landscape estimation practicum, a landscape drawing activity, identification of nursery materials (plants, disorders, equipment and supplies), and situation assessment and solution.
