## Montezuma FFA Wins 2012 Iowa FFA Soils Evaluation Career Development Event

The Iowa FFA Soils Evaluation Career Development Event was held at Iowa State University in Ames, on Saturday, October 6, 2012. Thirty teams and one hundred eighteen individuals qualified for the State Career Development Event designed to provide students an opportunity to display their knowledge and skills in the area of landscape and soil profile evaluation and land management.

The Soils Evaluation Career Development Event included the evaluation of four soil pits, plus a written exam about soils in Iowa. The score card used to judge the soil pits is divided into five parts: Surface Features, Soil Features – The Profile, Land Capability Classification and Productivity Potential, Evaluation of Management Practices, and Sustainability of Soils for Non-Agricultural Uses.

The first place team for the Career Development Event was the Montezuma FFA Chapter at Montezuma. Team members include: Steve Kopp, Vanessa Minner, Sidney Roorda, and Jack Little. The Agricultural Education Instructor and FFA Advisor is Rick Swenson. The second place team for the event was the Adair-Casey FFA Chapter at Adair. Team members include: Logan Dinkla, Anna Mulder, Jake Reed, and James Grubbs. The Agricultural Education Instructors and FFA Advisor is Mike Cooley.

Jack Little from Montezuma was named the champion individual. The top five teams advance to the National Land Judging Contest in May of 2013 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

The Iowa FFA Soils Evaluation Career Development Event was made possible through sponsorship by the Iowa FFA Foundation. Sponsorship provided covered individual rosettes and plaques for winning individuals, rosettes for winning teams as well as a plaque for the champion and reserve champion team.

The Iowa State University Department of Agronomy served as the host for the event. Dr. Lee Burras of Iowa State University and Mr. Virgil Schmidt of Iowa State University Extension coordinated the event.
