Their Agriculture Education instructor is Mr. Eric Kumm. Derek Hoodjer, from the Diamond Trail FFA Chapter at Monroe, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition. FFA teams from 21 chapters including 69 individuals participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the students an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Meats Evaluation. Activities included: placing carcass classes of beef, pork, and lamb; placing classes of wholesale and retail meat cuts; quality and yield grading beef carcasses; identifying retail meat cuts, and a problem solving activity.
