Starmont FFA Wins Iowa FFA Farm Management CDE

The Starmont FFA Chapter from Arlington was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Farm Management Career Development Event held at Iowa State University in Ames on April 21, 2015. Members of the first place team included: Adam Fliehler, Karl Klocke, Jaxon Goedken, and Spencer Pech. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Ms. Rachel Myers. They will represent Iowa at the National Farm Management Career Development Event in Louisville, Kentucky, in October. The Osage FFA Chapter from Osage was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Matthew Klaes, Joe Malecek, Jared Popp, and Rebekah Sletten. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Richard Schaufler. Spencer Pech, Starmont FFA, Arlington, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition. The St. Ansgar FFA Chapter from St. Ansgar was the winner of the Team Participation Activity.

FFA teams from 83 chapters participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the student an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Farm Management. The 313 individuals who participated in the event each completed an objective test which had three sections: economic principles, records and analysis, and risk management. All team members worked together to solve a problem related to break even analysis.

Dr. Ron Deiter, Professor of Economics at Iowa State University, Ames, Iowa, was the Career Development Event coordinator and prepared the test with assistance from Dr. Georgeane Artz, Assistant Professor of Economics.

Recognition and awards for FFA member and chapters include; plaques for the first and second place individual and trophies for the first place individual and teams, Top Ten Rosettes for Teams and Individuals, as well as travel money for the winning chapter to participate in the National FFA CDE. Awards and plaques were sponsored by the Iowa Farm Business Association through the Iowa FFA Foundation.
