AUDUBON FFA CHAPTER WINS 2015 STATE FFA HORSE CAREER DEVELOPMENT EVENT

The Audubon FFA Chapter was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Horse Career Development Event held at Ellsworth Community College in Iowa Falls on October 3, 2015. Members of the first place team included: Taylor Nielsen, McKenna Nielsen, and Macy DeBower. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Brittany Elmquist. They will represent Iowa at the National Horse Career Development Event at Louisville, Kentucky, in October. The Hudson FFA Chapter was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Alex Fouts, Madeline Herring, Meredith Williams, and Morgan Williams. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Dennis Deppe. Lexi Estes, Muscatine FFA Chapter, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

FFA teams from 26 chapters participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the student an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Equine Science. The 83 individual contestants evaluated halter and performance classes. They also answered questions over the classes and gave oral reasons to explain their placings. A written examination was included along with a team problem solving competition.

The Iowa FFA Horse Career Development Event was made possible through the Iowa FFA Foundation with support from Cargill Animal Nutrition. RAM Truck Brand, Tractor Supply Company, and Wahl Clipper Corporation through the National FFA Foundation, sponsored the Champion Team plaque.
