The Cascade FFA Chapter was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Nursery/Landsacpe Career Development Event held at Kirkwood Community College in Cedar Rapids on June 9, 2015. They will represent Iowa at the National Nursery/Landsacpe Career Development Event at Louisville, Kentucky, in October. The Muscatine FFA Chapter was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Carter Oldfield, J.T. Manjoine, Tyree Anfinson, and Auston Garrison. Their agriculture education instructors and FFA advisors are Mr Sam Paul, Mr. Dave Tometich, and Ms Ashley Wiebe. FFA teams from 12 chapters including 42 individuals participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide students an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Nursery/Landscape. The event consisted of a general knowledge exam, a landscape estimation practicum, a customer service activity, identification of nursery materials (plants, disorders, equipment and supplies), and situation assessment and solution.

The Iowa FFA Nursery Landscape Career Development Event was coordinated and conducted by Shawna Moss and the faculty and staff at Kirkwood Community College in Cedar Rapids.
