The Muscatine FFA Chapter from Muscatine was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Agricultural Mechanics Career Development Event held at Iowa State University in Ames in Iowa State University, Ames on June 8, 2017. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Bob DeHaan. Michael Dekker, Holland FFA, Orange City, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

FFA teams including 86 individuals from 25 chapters participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the student an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Agricultural Mechanics & Technology. Activities included demonstration of skills, problem solving, and knowledge application in agricultural machinery equipment, metals and welding, structures, environmental and natural resources, and electrical systems.
