# WAPELLO FFA CHAPTER WINS 2017 STATE FFA MEATS CAREER DEVELOPMENT EVENT

The Wapello FFA Chapter was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Meats Career Development Event held at Iowa State University in Ames on August 26, 2017. Members of the first place team included: Kenna Lanz, James Wykert, Makenna West, and Daniel Hemphill. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Ms. Danielle Wanfalt. They will represent Iowa at the National Meats Career Development Event at Indianapolis, Indiana, in October. The Little Switzerland FFA Chapter at Waukon was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Carmen Wille, Miranda Reinhardt, Erika Johnson, and Christa Heffern. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Ms. Jessica O'Connor. James Wykert, Wapello FFA Chapter, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

The FFA Meats Evaluation Career Development Event provides an opportunity for FFA members to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Meat Evaluation. Activities included: placing carcass classes of beef, pork, and lamb; placing classes of wholesale and retail meat cuts; quality and yield grading beef carcasses; identifying retail meat cuts, and a problem solving activity. There were 74 members participating from 21 chapters.

The Meats Evaluation and Technology Career Development Event was coordinated and conducted by Sherry Olsen and the ISU Meats Judging Team along with the faculty in the Meat Science Department of the Animal Science Department at Iowa State University.
