East Union FFA Wins 2017 Iowa FFA Soils Career Development Event

The East Union FFA Chapter from Afton was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Soils Evaluation Career Development Event held at Iowa State University on October 7, 2017. Members of the first place team included: Brody Granfield, Kanyon Huntington, Brayden Martinez, and Sidney McFee. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Mike Cooley. The Colo-NESCO FFA Chapter from Colo was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Alex Dunahoo, Claire Skinner, Spencer Short, and Adam Henderson. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Justin Chapman. Jared Theis, Montezuma FFA, Montezuma, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition. The top five teams will represent Iowa at the National Land Judging Event in May of 2017 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Montezuma FFA Chapter from Montezuma, Harlan FFA Chapter from Harlan, and Hawkeye FFA Chapter from West Bend will join the top two teams in Oklahoma.

FFA teams including from 30 chapters, including 114 individuals participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the student an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Soils Evaluation. The Soils Evaluation Career Development Event included the evaluation of four soil pits, plus a written exam about soils in Iowa. The score card used to judge the soil pits is divided into five parts: Surface Features, Soil Features – The Profile, Land Capability Classification and Productivity Potential, Evaluation of Management Practices, and Sustainability of Soils for Non-Agricultural Uses.

The Iowa FFA Soils Evaluation Career Development Event was made possible with support from Calcium Products, Inc. and Chemorse through the Iowa FFA Foundation. Sponsorship provided covered awards recognition of the top ten teams and individuals as well as a travel stipend for the national qualifying teams. The Iowa State University Department of Agronomy served as the host for the event. Amber Anderson of Iowa State University coordinated the event.
