NEWTON FFA CHAPTER WINS 2018 STATE FFA NURSERY/LANDSCAPE CAREER DEVELOPMENT EVENT

The Newton FFA Chapter was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Nursery/Landsacpe Career Development Event held at Kirkwood Community College on June 12, 2018. Members of the first place team included: Chazten Wells, Logan Chandler, and Jaden Adams. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. James Horn. They will represent Iowa at the National Nursery/Landsacpe Career Development Event at Indianapolis, Iindiana, in October. The Louisa-Muscatine FFA Chapter at Letts was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Cody Calvelage, Joseph Browning, and Wylie Jacobs. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Adam Crews. Chazten Wells, Newton FFA, Newton, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

FFA teams from 11 chapters including 39 individuals participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide students an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Nursery/Landscape. The event consisted of a general knowledge exam, a landscape estimation practicum, a customer service activity, identification of nursery materials (plants, disorders, equipment and supplies), and situation assessment and solution.

The Iowa FFA Nursery Landscape Career Development Event was coordinated and conducted by Shawna Moss and the faculty and staff at Kirkwood Community College in Cedar Rapids. Kirkwood Community College also provided a lunch to all participants. The Iowa FFA Nursery Landscape Career Development Event was made possible with support from the Wapello FFA Chapter through the Iowa FFA Foundation.
