# 2018 Iowa FFA Proficiency Award Results

ANKENY, Iowa--100% of FFA members have proficiencies as part of the agricultural program and the FFA. These proficiencies range in the areas of Agricultural Communications to Home and/or Community Development and from Diversified Agricultural Production to Swine Production. Proficiency Award winners have excelled in their Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) Programs. These awards encourage members to develop specialized skills that will apply toward a future career.

State winners will advance to the National FFA competition where they will compete against winners from the other State FFA Associations. The four national finalists that are selected from each area will be recognized at the National FFA Convention and Expo in October.

Scholerman will graduate high school in 2019 and plans attend college and major in pre-vet science.

She has devoted over 200 hours to her research of bacterial inhibition in unpasteurized bovine milk. Westhoff has spent time formulating hypotheses, performing experiments and tests, and collecting data regarding her research.

He has dedicated 281 hours to his research and plans to continue in the future all the while studying the effects and ways to prevent these dangerous plant diseases.

After graduation Danielle plans to attend Iowa State University with a double major in Animal Science and Genetics while pursuing a Pre-Veterinary emphasis.

He has focused his product on genetic improvement for is herd by exporting embryos to 8 different countries, marketing animals, and constantly increasing their value. Kruse is currently a senior at Maquoketa Valley.

Costello is currently a senior at North Scott and is serving as chapter President.
