Brokaw FFA Wins 2018 Iowa FFA Soils Career Development Event

The Brokaw FFA Chapter from Clarinda was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Soils Evaluation Career Development Event held at Iowa State University on October 20, 2018. Members of the first place team included: Ethan Herzberg, Alex Baker, Brett Robberts, and Bradlie Wilmes. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Andrew Johnson. The AGWSR FFA Chapter from Ackley was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Jenna Shahan, Darren Veld, Lane Abbas, and Morgan Bakker. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. James Abbas. Ethan Herzberg, Brokaw FFA, Clarinda, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition. The top five teams will represent Iowa at the National Land Judging Event in May of 2017 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. East Union FFA Chapter from Afton, Sigourney FFA Chapter from Sigourney, and Manson Northwest Webster FFA Chapter from Manson will join the top two teams in Oklahoma.

FFA teams including from 29 chapters, including 112 individuals participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the student an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Soils Evaluation. The Soils Evaluation Career Development Event included the evaluation of four soil pits, plus a written exam about soils in Iowa. The score card used to judge the soil pits is divided into five parts: Surface Features, Soil Features – The Profile, Land Capability Classification and Productivity Potential, Evaluation of Management Practices, and Sustainability of Soils for Non-Agricultural Uses.

The Iowa FFA Soils Evaluation Career Development Event was made possible with support through the Iowa FFA Foundation. The Iowa State University Department of Agronomy served as the host for the event. Amber Anderson of Iowa State University coordinated the event.
