# DIAMOND TRAIL FFA WINS IOWA FFA FOOD SCIENCE CDE

The Diamond Trail FFA Chapter from Monroe was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Food Science Career Development Event held at Iowa State University on June 20, 2019. Members of the first place team included: Blake Van Der Kamp, Arthur VanWyk, Morgan DeHaai, and Alexis Dross. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mrs. Amber Samson. They will represent Iowa at the National Food Science Career Development Event at Indianapolis, Indiana, in October. The North Scott FFA Chapter from Eldridge was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Grace Bjustrom, Chloe Engelbrecht, Glory Hansel, and Kara Rohlf. Their agriculture education instructors and FFA advisors are Mr. Jacob Hunter and Mrs Jen Westphal. Blake Van Der Kamp, Diamond Trail FFA, Monroe, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

FFA teams from 12 chapters participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the student an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Food Science. The 46 individuals who participated in the event completed several activities including demonstration of skills and problem solving in dealing with consumer concerns, food safety and sanitation, aroma identification, taste testing, and product differences. A written examination was included along with a team product development competition.

The Iowa FFA Food Science Career Development Event was coordinated and conducted by Dr. Terri Boylston, and numerous other faculty and staff with the Iowa State University Department of Food Science & Human Nutrition in Ames. The top individual receives a \$500 scholarship from the Iowa State University Department of Food Science & Human Nutrition if the student chooses to major in Food Science at Iowa State University.
