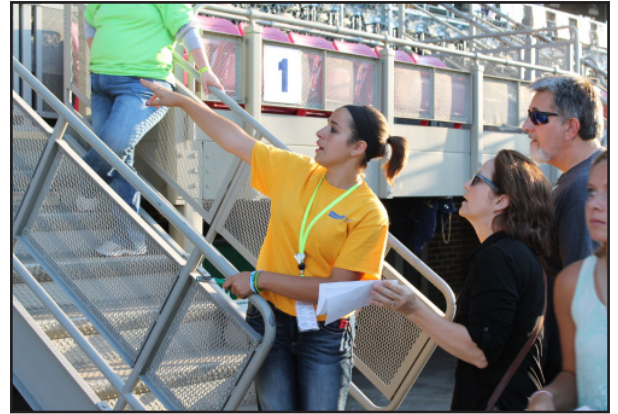


# FFA free stage attendants & grandstand ushers

## who we are

For over 70 years, FFA members from across the state have experienced the Iowa State Fair serving as a Free Stage Attendant or a Grandstand Usher. FFA members are selected through an application process during June. Once fair time rolls around, members move to the Iowa State Fairgrounds in Des Moines one or two days prior to the fair starting. FFA members selected as *Attendants and Ushers* are provided with housing and meals throughout the duration of the fair on the fairgrounds at the Youth Inn. Members are supervised by two program superintendents, state FFA staff, and state FFA officers.



## what we do

*Free Stage Attendants* spend their time at the fair helping set up and tear down acts on the five free stages.

*Free Stage Attendants* work closely with acts and stage crew members to prepare for performances of all types.

*Grandstand Ushers* help distribute fair programs during the day and help seat 14,000 grandstand guests in the evening.

*Grandstand Ushers* have the responsibility to make the fair experience as one of the first people you see when you come to the fair and possibly the last at the end of the day.

*Attendants and Ushers* also complete other tasks throughout the fair when asked by the Iowa FFA Association or the Iowa State Fair including helping

## why apply?

FFA members who serve as serve in this capacity get to see the state fair while developing leadership skills including responsibility, time management, and communication.

Members selected to serve as Attendants and Ushers are asked to make the experience what they want to make it while representing their family, FFA chapter, and the 16,000+ Iowa FFA members. On our first night together, members are given the opportunity to become familiar with the fairgrounds and get to know each other through group activities.

The next 10 days members are encouraged to see the fair or hang out with fellow FFA members serving as Attendants and Ushers.
