FFA teams from 9 chapters including 35 individuals participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide students an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Nursery/Landscape. The event consisted of a general knowledge exam, a landscape estimation practicum, a landscape drawing activity, identification of nursery materials (plants, disorders, equipment and supplies), and situation assessment and solution.
