WAPELLO FFA WINS IOWA FFA FOOD SCIENCE CDE

The Wapello FFA Chapter from Wapello was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Food Science Career Development Event held at Iowa State University in Ames on June 4, 2015. Members of the first place team included: Karlee Carey, Maliree Reid, Cheyanne Hunt, and Arin Howell. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Cole Rushing. They will represent Iowa at the National Food Science Career Development Event at Louisville, Kentucky, in October. The Sumner Fredericksburg FFA Chapter from Sumner was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Lindsey Bouska, Nathan Arthur, Lindsey Meyer, and Erika Ackerman. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Ms. Meghan Bond. Jessica Meseck, Denison FFA, Denison, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

FFA teams from 14 chapters participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the student an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Food Science. The 52 individuals who participated in the event completed several activities including demonstration of skills and problem solving in dealing with consumer concerns, food safety and sanitation, aroma identification, taste testing, and product differences. A written examination was included along with a team product development competition.

The Iowa FFA Food Science Career Development Event was coordinated and conducted by Dr. Terri Boylston, and numerous other faculty and staff with the Iowa State University Department of Food Science & Human Nutrition in Ames. The top individual receives a \$500 scholarship from the Iowa State University Department of Food Science & Human Nutrition if the student chooses to major in Food Science at Iowa State University.

The Iowa FFA Food Science Career Development Event was made possible with support from Heartland Cooperative through the Iowa FFA Foundation. Kraft Foods, Inc., through the National FFA Foundation sponsored the champion plaque for the winning team.
