Members of the first place team included: Larame Boysen, Arin Howell, Nick McCleary, and Maliree Reid. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Cole Rushing. They will represent Iowa at the National Poultry Evaluation Career Development Event at Louisville, Kentucky, in October. The Wapsie Valley FFA Chapter at Fairbank was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Austin Schares, Emily Martins, Jackson Willey, and Sean Banger. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Ms. Ellen Doese. Maliree Reid, Wapello FFA Chapter, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

The FFA Poultry Evaluation Evaluation Career Development Event provides an opportunity for FFA members to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Poultry Evaluation. Activities included: placing classes of live poultry; placing and grading classes of ready to cook poultry; grading classes of egg interiors and exteriors; identifying and grading further process poultry products, and a poultry production examination. There were 187 members participating from 51 chapters.

The Poultry Evaluation and Technology Career Development Event was coordinated and conducted by Cameron Hall and the Poultry Science Staff of the Animal Science Department at Iowa State University.
