DES MOINES FFA CHAPTER WINS 2017 STATE FFA HORSE CAREER DEVELOPMENT EVENT

The Des Moines FFA Chapter was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Horse Career Development Event held at Kirkwood Community College in Cedar Rapids on June 13, 2017. Members of the first place team included: Nadine Garcia, Josephine Hill, Samuel Stevens, and Zoie Wagner. Their agriculture education instructors and FFA advisors are Mr. Kevin Anderson and Mr. Craig Nelson. They will represent Iowa at the National Horse Career Development Event at Indianapolis, Indiana, in October. The Muscatine FFA Chapter was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Summer Neece, Hannah Spies, Dakota Heath, and Kaylee Goddard. Their agriculture education instructors and FFA advisors are Mr Sam Paul, Mr. Dave Tometich, and Ms Ashley Wiebe. Erica Mehlhaus, Boone A&M FFA Chapter, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

FFA teams from 23 chapters participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the student an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Equine Science. The 70 individual contestants evaluated halter and performance classes. They also answered questions over the classes and gave oral reasons to explain their placings. A written examination was included along with a team problem solving competition.
