LOUISA-MUSCATINE FFA CHAPTER AT LETTS WINS 2017 STATE FFA LIVESTOCK CAREER DEVELOPMENT EVENT

The Louisa-Muscatine FFA Chapter at Letts was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Livestock Career Development Event held at Iowa State University in Ames on August 26, 2017. Members of the first place team included: Jackson Soy, Brandon Burmeister, Will Kiesewetter, and Addison Randall. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Adam Crews. They will represent Iowa at the National Livestock Career Development Event at Indianapolis, Indiana, in October. The West Branch FFA Chapter was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Ethan Fetzer, Emily Harold, Brady Edge, and Kaitlyn Edge. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mrs. Renee Thompson. Logan Sieren, Keota FFA Chapter, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

The FFA Livestock Evaluation Career Development Event provides an opportunity for FFA members to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Livestock Evaluation. Activities included: placing breeding and market classes of beef, swine, sheep and goats; keep/cull and oral reasons classes; and a general knowledge test. There were 152 members participating from 43 chapters.

The Iowa FFA Livestock Evaluation Career Development Event was made possible through the Iowa FFA Foundation with support from Iowa State University Block & Bridle. Bayer, through the National FFA Foundation, sponsored the Champion Team plaque.

The Livestock Evaluation Career Development Event was coordinated and conducted by Chris Cassady and other faculty and staff with the Animal Science Department at Iowa State University.
