MUSCATINE FFA CHAPTER WINS 2017 STATE FFA NURSERY/LANDSCAPE CAREER DEVELOPMENT EVENT

The Muscatine FFA Chapter was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Nursery/Landsacpe Career Development Event held at Kirkwood Community College in Cedar Rapids on June 13, 2017. Members of the first place team included: Carter Oldfield, Kaleigh Bell, Elaina Lee, and Allen Tian. Their agriculture education instructors and FFA advisors are Mr Sam Paul, Mr. Dave Tometich, and Ms Ashley Wiebe. They will represent Iowa at the National Nursery/Landsacpe Career Development Event at Indianapolis, Iindiana, in October. The Newton FFA Chapter was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Jaden Adams, Logan Chandler, Lindsay Campbell, and Laura Townsend. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. James Horn. Carter Oldfield, Muscatine FFA, Muscatine, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

FFA teams from 10 chapters including 33 individuals participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide students an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Nursery/Landscape. The event consisted of a general knowledge exam, a landscape estimation practicum, a customer service activity, identification of nursery materials (plants, disorders, equipment and supplies), and situation assessment and solution.

The Iowa FFA Nursery Landscape Career Development Event was coordinated and conducted by Shawna Moss and the faculty and staff at Kirkwood Community College in Cedar Rapids. Kirkwood Community College also provided a lunch to all participants.
