PELLA FFA CHAPTER WINS 2018 STATE FFA HORSE CAREER DEVELOPMENT EVENT

The Pella FFA Chapter was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Horse Career Development Event held at Kirkwood Community College on June 12, 2018. Members of the first place team included: Camryn Norton, Zacharaiah Thorson, and Shianne Votava. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Jacob Bowers. They will represent Iowa at the National Horse Career Development Event at Indianapolis, Indiana, in October. The West Dubuque FFA Chapter at Epworth was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Regan Demmer, Madison Strief, and Trenton Hammerand. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Luke Rauen. Madison Strief, West Dubuque FFA Chapter at Epworth, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

FFA teams from 25 chapters participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the student an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Equine Science. The 72 individual contestants evaluated halter and performance classes. They also answered questions over the classes and gave oral reasons to explain their placings. A written examination was included along with a team problem solving competition.

The Iowa FFA Horse Career Development Event was made possible through the Iowa FFA Foundation. RAM Truck Brand, Standlee, Tractor Supply Company, and Wahl Clipper Corporation through the National FFA Foundation, sponsored the Champion Team plaque.
