GILBERT FFA CHAPTER FFA WINS IOWA FFA FOOD SCIENCE CDE

The Gilbert FFA Chapter FFA Chapter from Gilbert was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Food Science Career Development Event held at Iowa State University on June 10, 2021. Members of the first place team included: Abby Dies, Josie Baggs, Hadley Boshart, and Elizebeth Fierce. Their agriculture education instructors and FFA advisors are Mr. Jon K. Davis and Mrs. Carolyn Miller. They will represent Iowa at the National Food Science Career Development Event at Indianapolis, Indiana, in October. The Sioux Central FFA Chapter from Sioux Rapids was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Laina Sangwin, Allison Ehlers, and Halle Laursen. Their agriculture education instructors and FFA advisors are Mr. Eric Koehlmoos and Melanie Bloom. Adele Hogan, Monticello FFA, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

FFA teams from 13 chapters participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the student an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Food Science. The 44 individuals who participated in the event completed several activities including demonstration of skills and problem solving in dealing with consumer concerns, food safety and sanitation, aroma identification, taste testing, and product differences. A written examination was included along with a team product development competition.

The Iowa FFA Food Science Career Development Event was coordinated and conducted by Dr. Terri Boylston, and numerous other faculty and staff with the Iowa State University Department of Food Science & Human Nutrition in Ames. The top individual receives a \$500 scholarship from the Iowa State University Department of Food Science & Human Nutrition if the student chooses to major in Food Science at Iowa State University.
