Brokaw FFA Wins 2021 Iowa FFA Soils Career Development Event

The Brokaw FFA Chapter from Clarinda was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Soils Evaluation Career Development Event held at Iowa State University on October 9, 2021. Members of the first place team included: Allyson Johnson, Owen Johnson, Nathan King, and Phoebe Garrett. Their agriculture education instructors and FFA advisors are Mr. Andrew Johnson, Mrs. Logan Henry, and Mrs. Emma Cutler. The East Union FFA Chapter from Afton was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Abbie Wuebker, Emmet Long, Elizabeth Hadley, and Riley Long. Their agriculture education instructors and FFA advisors are Mr. Mike Cooley and Mr. James Erlbacher. Dustin Barker, Adel DeSoto Minburn FFA, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

FFA teams including from 30 chapters, including 119 individuals participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the student an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Soils Evaluation. The Soils Evaluation Career Development Event included the evaluation of four soil pits, plus a written exam about soils in Iowa. The score card used to judge the soil pits is divided into five parts: Surface Features, Soil Features – The Profile, Land Capability Classification and Productivity Potential, Evaluation of Management Practices, and Sustainability of Soils for Non-Agricultural Uses.

The Iowa FFA Soils Evaluation Career Development Event was made possible with support from Heartland Co-op through the Iowa FFA Foundation. The Iowa State University Department of Agronomy and the Iowa State Horticulture Research Station served as the host site for the event. Nick Howell, the Horticulture Research Station farm manager along with Brandon and Chad were hosts for the event. The Iowa State University Soils Judging Team served as pit monitors. Amber Anderson of Iowa State University coordinated the event. The official judges were Rich Pope, Dr. Lee Burress, Dr. Bradley Miller, Meyer Bohn and Amber Anderson. This is Rich Pope's 35th year assisting at this event.
