The Muscatine FFA Chapter was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Meats Career Development Event held by Iowa State University on August 27, 2022. Members of the first place team included: Robert Carver, Jenna Lovstad, Cory Shank, and Kat Carver. Their agriculture education instructors and FFA advisors are Mr. Sam Paul, Mr. Dave Tometich, Ms. Ashley Wiebe, and Mrs. Alexa Scherer. The South O'Brien FFA Chapter was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Payton Farquhar, Abby Stout, Gabe Moermond, and Bensen Rohwer. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Eric Kumm. Blake Oostenink, Sioux Center FFA Chapter, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

The FFA Meats Evaluation Career Development Event provides an opportunity for FFA members to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Meat Evaluation. Activities included: placing carcass classes of beef, pork, and lamb; placing classes of wholesale and retail meat cuts; quality and yield grading beef carcasses; identifying retail meat cuts, and a problem solving activity. There were 45 members participating from 13 chapters.

The Iowa FFA Meats Evaluation Career Development Event was made possible with support by Iowa Pork Producers Association and Iowa FFA Gold Standard Partners.
