The Muscatine FFA Chapter was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Nursery/Landscape Career Development Event held at Kirkwood Community College on June 13, 2023. Their agriculture education instructors and FFA advisors are Mr. Sam Paul, Mr. Dave Tometich, Ms. Ashley Wiebe, and Mrs. Alexa Coobs. They will represent Iowa at the National Nursery/Landscape Career Development Event at Indianapolis, Indiana, in October. The Holland FFA Chapter at Orange City was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Zachary Rabe, Kienna Lassen, and Lily Moeller. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mrs. Molly Cleveringa. Caleb Teed, Muscatine FFA, Muscatine, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

FFA teams from 18 chapters including 65 individuals participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide students an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Nursery/Landscape. The event consisted of a general knowledge exam, a landscape estimation practicum, identification of nursery materials (plants, disorders, equipment and supplies), equipment operations practicums, and a team skills challenge.

The Iowa FFA Nursery Landscape Career Development Event was coordinated and conducted by Shawna Moss, Adam Boysen and the faculty and staff at Kirkwood Community College in Cedar Rapids. Kirkwood Community College also provided a lunch to all participants.
