95th Iowa FFA State Leadership Conference

AMES, IA - The Iowa FFA Public Speaking Leadership Development Event (LDE) was held at the Iowa State Center, Ames, on Monday, April 17, 2023. Twelve individuals participated in this year's LDE. The first place individual for the event was Tucker Rohrig from the Creston FFA Chapter. Their agriculture education instructors and FFA advisors are Mrs. Kelsey Bailey and Mr. Ethan Faeth. The second place individual for the event was Annabelle Newton from the Vinton-Shellsburg FFA Chapter. This event is designed to develop rural and agricultural leadership, to provide for member participation in agricultural public speaking activities and to stimulate interest along such lines. The prepared public speaking event requires participants to write and deliver a six-to-eight minute speech in front of a panel of judges. Scoring is based on the written manuscript, the delivery of the speech and the answers to questions.
