Grinnell FFA Wins Iowa FFA Ag Biotechnology CDE

AMES, Iowa--The Grinnell FFA Chapter from Grinnell was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Biotechnology Career Development Event held at Iowa State University, Ames on April 14, 2025. The Midland FFA Chapter from Wyoming was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Jayson Ruley, Bryce Leeper, Carter Willms, and Sophia Hunter. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Ms. Jamie Christiansen. Maggie Dayton, Grinnell FFA, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

FFA teams from 61 chapters participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the student an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Biotechnology. The 237 individuals who participated in the event completed several activities including a general knowledge exam and an identification activity. The team members also collaborated in a team activity relating to biotechnology principles.
