Brokaw FFA Wins 2025 Iowa FFA Soils Career Development Event

The Brokaw FFA Chapter from Clarinda was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Soils Evaluation Career Development Event held at Iowa State University on October 9, 2025. Members of the first place team included: Elaina Hesse, Alayna Shepherd, Noah Wellhausen, and Haidyn Garrett. Their agriculture education instructors and FFA advisors are Mr. Andrew Johnson, Mrs. Logan Henry, and Mrs. Emma Cutler. The Colo-NESCO FFA Chapter from Colo was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Emma Lennie, Blake Obrecht, Gavin Larsen, and Audrey Campbell. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Todd Frohwein. Haley Smith, AGWSR FFA, Ackley, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition. The top five teams will represent Iowa at the National Land Judging Event in May in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Harlan FFA, Harlan; Sioux Center FFA, Sioux Center; and Grinnell FFA will join the top two teams in Oklahoma.

FFA teams including from 30 chapters, including 117 individuals participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the student an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Soils Evaluation. The Soils Evaluation Career Development Event included the evaluation of four soil pits, plus a written exam about soils in Iowa. The score card used to judge the soil pits is divided into five parts: Surface Features, Soil Features – The Profile, Land Capability Classification and Productivity Potential, Evaluation of Management Practices, and Sustainability of Soils for Non-Agricultural Uses.

The Iowa FFA Soils Evaluation Career Development Event was made possible with support from Heartland Co-op through the Iowa FFA Foundation. The Iowa State University Department of Agronomy and the Iowa State Worle Farm served as the host site for the event. Tim Youngquist farm specialist with the ISU strips project and Karl Nicolaus with ISU farms, hosted the event. The Iowa State University Soils Judging Team and several PhD students in Soil Science served as pit monitors. Amber Anderson of Iowa State University coordinated the event. The official judges were Rich Pope, Lee Burras and Amber Anderson.
