2009 Stars Over Iowa Winners

81st Iowa FFA Leadership Conference

The 2009 Stars Over Iowa were announced at Veterans Memorial Auditorium, Des Moines, on Friday, April 17, 2009. Twenty-four finalists were introduced in four different areas: Agricultural Placement, Agriscience, Agribusiness, and Agricultural Production. The members were selected as a result of receiving the Iowa FFA Degree. The Iowa FFA Degree is the highest honor that can be bestowed on an FFA member by the state association. Five hundred twelve members received the Iowa FFA Degree in 2009 and twenty-four of those members were selected for outstanding recognition in the Stars Over Iowa ceremony.
