2010 Iowa FFA Meats Career Development Event

The Diamond Trail FFA Chapter at Monroe was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Meats Evaluation Career Development Event held at Iowa State University in Ames on August 28, 2010. Members of the first place team included: Mason Lewis, Kilian Van Soelen, Bre Branderhorst, and Dan Cole. Their Ag Education instructor is Ed Ricks . The South O'Brien FFA Chapter from Paullina was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Eric Magnussen, Colton Barnes, Craig DeBoer, and Colton Ebel. Their Ag Education instructor is Mr. Eric Kumm. Mason Lewis, from the Diamond Trail FFA Chapter at Monroe, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition. FFA teams from 27 chapters including 99 individuals participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the students an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Meats Evaluation. Activities included: placing carcass classes of beef, pork, and lamb; placing classes of wholesale and retail meat cuts; quality and yield grading beef carcasses; identifying retail meat cuts, and a problem solving activity.

The Meats Evaluation Career Development Event was coordinated and conducted by the faculty and staff with the Animal Science Department at Iowa State University.

Cargill Meat Solutions, Hormel Foods Corporation, Kraft Foods Inc.-Oscar Mayer Division, and Tyson Foods, Inc. through the National FFA Foundation, sponsored the Champion Team plaque.
