They will represent Iowa at the National Farm Management Career Development Event at Indianapolis, Indiana, in October. The Guthrie Center Tiger FFA Chapter from Guthrie Center was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Dustin Clark, Shaun Finnigan, William Frels, and Seth Wilson. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Jim Calvert. Carrie Graham, Montezuma FFA, Montezuma, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition. The Guthrie Center FFA was the winner of the Team Participation Activity.

FFA teams from 75 chapters participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide the student an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Farm Management. The 277 individuals who participated in the event each completed an objective test which had three sections: economic principles, records and analysis, and risk management. All team members worked together to solve a problem related to break even analysis.

Dr. Ron Deiter, Professor of Economics at Iowa State University, Ames, Iowa, was the Career Development Event coordinator and prepared the test.
