FFA teams from 9 chapters including 31 individuals participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide students an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Nursery/Landscape. The event consisted of a general knowledge exam, a landscape estimation practicum, a landsape drawing activity, identification of nursery materials (plants, disorders, equipment and supplies), and situation assessment and solution.
