2016 Iowa FFA Proficiency Award Results

ANKENY, Iowa--100% of all FFA members have proficiencies as part of the agricultural program and the FFA. These proficiencies range in the areas of Agricultural Communications to Home and/or Community Development and from Diversified Agricultural Production to Swine Production. Proficiency Award winners have excelled in their Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) Programs. These awards encourage members to develop specialized skills that will apply toward a future career.

State winners will advance to the National FFA competition where they will compete against winners from the other State FFA Associations. The four national finalists that are selected from each area will be recognized at the National FFA Convention and Expo in October.

The Iowa FFA Proficiency Awards program is possible with support from the many partners of the Iowa FFA Foundation. The specific partner for each area is identified in our summary of results.

Proficiency Area: Agricultural Communications - Entrepreneurship/Placement

State Winner: Emily Campbell Audubon FFA Chapter

Description: In the area of Agricultural Communications, our winner is Emily Campbell of the Audubon FFA Chapter. Campbell earned \$900 while inputting 190 hours into her project by applying principles of entrepreneurship. She has been able to successfully market and grow her business. Campbell plans to attend Iowa State University to major in Agricultural Studies.

Over the past four years, Isbell has worked a total of 316 hours at her placement at Vinton-Shellsburg High School. She gained skills through teaching third and fourth graders, being involved in community day projects, and creating an interactive barn - complete with petting zoo and interactive displays. Following high school, Isbell would like to become an Agricultural Education instructor.

Description: The winner in the area of Agricultural Mechanics Design and Fabrication is Jordan Flick of the New Hampton FFA Chapter. Flick has earned \$24,204 by working over 2,500 hours in his project. By working this many hours, he has developed unique skills which include using geospatial technology in agricultural applications. In the future, Flick plans to graduate from Iowa State University with a degree in Agricultural Engineering.

He used repair and operator manuals to assist in most of his project but his skills in MIG welding and wiring helped complete the restoration. Samuelson plans to attend Iowa State University and major in Agricultural Systems & Technology.

Description: The winner in the area of Ag Mechanics Repair and Maintenance Placement is Micheal Walvatne of the North Fayette Valley FFA Chapter at West Union. Over four years, Walvatne has worked 4,337 hours while successfully investing over \$50,000. He has learned to diagnose and repair electrical power systems in agricultural environments such as following plans and wiring electrical panels. Walvatne plans to continue his education at Northeast Iowa Community College studying the industrial electrical program.

The second place winner is Harrison Gebers of the Ridge View FFA Chapter at Holstein is the runner up in this area.

He has spent more than 250 hours conducting three comprehensive agronomic research studies. He has evaluated corn fertilization systems, intensive corn management, and intensive soybean management. Trygve plans to pursue a career in agronomy.

Andrew is skilled in building relationships with others and enhancing his knowledge of financial services, which have led to him being able to take out a loan. In addition, he has been certified in artificial insemination. Palmersheim plans to attend a 2-year college close to home to manage and expand his cow/calf herd.

Bennis has worked over 1,800 hours by caring, feeding and breeding her family's beef cows. By completing these tasks, she has been able to gain knowledge in calculating feed rations and implementing disease prevention programs. She has also learned how to apply scientific principles to the process of making breeding selections. After high school, Bennis plans to attend Iowa State University and major in Animal Science.

Description: In the area of Dairy Production Entrepreneurship, our winner is Kaleb Kruse of the Maquoketa Valley FFA Chapter at Delhi. Kaleb currently operates ½ of a partnership between him and his brothers that consists of 32 head of dairy cows and heifers. One of the most important parts of his project has been developing the best genetics for his herd by using artificial insemination and embryo technology. Kruse plans to attend Iowa State University and major in Dairy Science.

Over the past four years, Nathan has worked a total of 3,875 paid and unpaid hours earning \$16,025 on the family farm. He gained skills in managing a 125 head dairy operation which includes sanitation and genetic selection through the use of artificial insemination. Nathan plans to attend Iowa State University studying Dairy Science.

Description: Spencer Pech of the Starmont FFA Chapter at Arlington is the winner in the area of Diversified Ag Production Placement, sponsored by Hertz Farm Management through the Iowa FFA Foundation. Spencer progressed from 11 hours on the family farm to over 600 hours on the farm and for an ag service provider. He experienced most growth in ag service and communication areas, as well as a love for agricultural natural resources. After high school, Pech plans to attend Iowa State University to pursue a degree in ag engineering as it applies to soil and water management.

He learned the importance of building good working relationships with landowners, bankers, and agronomists, as well as manage all of the technical inputs required to produce a quality grain crop. After high school - Carlson plans to attend Iowa State University and earn a degree in agriculture, and will return to their family farm to become a partner-owner.

After high school she plans to attend a university to pursue a degree in veterinary science attempting her goal to be accepted in vet school.

Following ILCC, she will attend Iowa State University majoring in agricultural education with an endorsement in special education.
