AMES, IA - The Iowa FFA Ag Issues and Perceptions Leadership Event was held at Iowa State University, Ames, on Monday, April 10, 2017. Twelve Chapters participated in this year's Career Development Event (CDE). The first place chapter for the event was the Osage FFA Chapter. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mrs. Melissa Moretz. The second place chapter for the event was the Midland FFA Chapter at Wyoming. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Miss Jamie Christiansen.

Ag Issues and Perceptions is a team event that requires chapters to have a firm understanding of how issues in agriculture develop. Participants were challenged to develop a portfolio and deliver a presentation that stressed both the pros and cons the issue. Verbal skills and presentation abilities were used to defend their issue through a series of questions.
